PROGRAM: Judge Katherine Emery



Judge Emery from the Washington County Court of Common Please spoke on "What the Constitution Means to Me". The Judge gave a brief history of the founding of our country and the writing of the document to govern the country.

James Madison is given most of the credit for this great document that has provided broad guidelines (guard rails) for the states to follow.

The original had no Bill of Rights as this was added later.

Articles I,II,II set the duties of each branch of government.

- Article III the Judiciary is the shortest of the Articles provides for our present-day system of courts.
- Judge Emery provided a general overview of the Constitution and reflected on individual rights that are granted within the framework of the document.
- She also noted that the Pennsylvania State Constitution is one of the oldest.

Supreme Court decisions were discussed as well as the number of judges to be appointed. The Supreme Court began with 6 judges and 9 currently serve life terms or until the judge decides to retire.

The membership appreciated **Judge Emery** being with us for this meeting, and it is certain that everyone learned a little something more about our Constitution.
