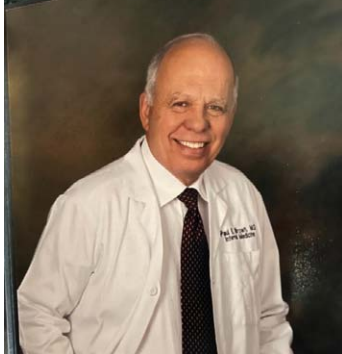

A Second Chance for Life-Pacemakers Dr. Paul Brown

Paul Edward Brown, Jr MD, FAAC graduated from Emory & Henry in 1964, Medical College of Virginia in 1969, completed an internship at Medical College of Virginia where he participated in the world's 2nd heart transplant/residency at Tuft's Medical School in Boston, helping create the prototype for cardiac pacemakers in association with American Optical scientific division.

Paul served in NATO forces in Augsburg, Germany as chief of medicine at the US 30th Field Hospital. Returning to the US in 1976, he founded Johnson City Internal Medicine Associates, retiring in 2021. The Johnson City Internal Medicine Associates has won multiple awards as the #1 quality care medical team in TN and in the United States with its full integrative staff.

Paul's career has spanned internal medicine with a specialty in heart- multiple firsts in our region with pacemakers, Holter monitors, and ECHO cardiology. He helped with the establishment of Quillen Medical School and has been a Clinical Professor of Medicine since its inception.

History of the Red Kettle

In 1891, Salvation Army Captain Joseph McFee was distraught because so many poor individuals in San Francisco were going hungry. During the holiday season, he resolved to provide a free Christmas dinner for the destitute and poverty-stricken. He only had one major hurdle to overcome -- funding the project.

Where would the money come from, he wondered. He lay awake nights, worrying, thinking, praying about how he could find the funds to fulfill his commitment of feeding 1,000 of the city's poorest individuals on Christmas Day. As he pondered the issue, his thoughts drifted back to his sailor days in Liverpool, England. He remembered how at Stage Landing, where the boats came in, there was a large, iron kettle called "Simpson's Pot" into which passers-by tossed a coin or two to help the poor.

The next day Captain McFee placed a similar pot at the Oakland Ferry Landing at the foot of Market Street. Beside the pot, he placed a sign that read, "Keep the Pot Boiling." He soon had the money to see that the needy people were properly fed at Christmas.
