Announcements included a reminder of the service project on Friday, June 27, from 8:00am to 12:00 noon. Club members (and guests) will be working in Kennedy Elementary's Pollinator Garden.

There will be no meeting on July 2 due to the holiday. The Passing of the gavel will be held on July 9.

Kitty Frazier introduced the week's speaker, Stephanie Griffin, Supervisor of the Archives at the Kingsport Library. The Archives are housed in Kingsport City Hall on the 5th floor. The Archives were established in 1994, with the mission to preserve and provide access to the documentary heritage of Kingsport. The department operates by appointment only; visitors must stop at the City Hall information desk to receive an elevator pass. The Archives include one-of-a-kind historical materials that cannot be checked out, due to preservation issues. Materials include: letters, memoirs, diaries, scrapbooks, directories, yearbooks, photos, maps, architectural drawings, blueprints, tapes, legal documents, and organizational records.



The Kingsport Rotary Club is represented in the Archives. Documents include: 1923 Charter, Club Constitution and bylaws, Rotary flags, certificates, and anniversary booklets (25th, 80th, 85th, and 100th).

Additional collections include 17 volumes of Tennessee Eastman newsletters with have been digitized and are viewable online via KingsportLibrary.org.

Community donations are essential for building the collection. Items must be in good condition; mold or water-damaged items cannot be accepted. Archivists can assist in identifying what is appropriate for donation through a phone consultation.

Friends of the Archives is an active support group helping raise awareness and funds. Membership information is available online.

- Promoting high standards of seamanship, subscribing to and abiding by recognized yachting customs and etiquette on the water.
- To offer social events and community service opportunities to those Rotarians participating in the sport of yachting, cruising, fishing, canoeing, water skiing, and other water sports which involves ships and boats.
