About This Week's Program



Cardinal News was created in the summer of 2021, as legacy newspapers throughout Southwest and Southside Virginia suffered additional devastating staff reductions brought on by an out-of-state corporate owner. These brutal cutbacks followed several years of belt-tightening that already had brought painful reductions to newsroom resources. And, most importantly, these contractions were bringing real harm to the communities that had long depended on their newspapers to tell their stories and to hold the powerful accountable.

The journalists and long-time newspaper leaders who would become the start of Cardinal News mourned this loss. So did neighbors, community leaders, businesspeople and even politicians. For years, conversations always ended the same way: Someone should do something. But no one did anything.

But then, in April 2021, when nine more newsroom staffers were on the chopping block at The Roanoke Times spelling an end to consistent in-depth and political reporting, longtime journalist Luanne Rife and former publisher Debbie Meade, soon joined by others, became the someones who would do something.

Along with Carilion communications expert Chris Turnbull, they began exploring the possibility of creating a nonprofit, online newspaper that specialized in in-depth reporting of three topics: politics, the economy, and culture. They started with a foundational principle: **People need independent, unbiased information about their communities in order for their communities to be vibrant.**

They knew people living in the forgotten, easily dismissed parts of Virginia – Southwest and Southside – yearned for stories that told them more about themselves, and that were heard in the state's political and economic center. Cardinal couldn't stand by and allow powerful people to make policies and decisions that affect us and our communities without knowing who we are, what our assets are, and what our challenges are.

Cardinal is a nonprofit 501c3 corporation that relies solely on gifts from foundations, corporations and individuals. It believes strongly in transparency and publishes the names of all donors to its website with monthly updates. This week's bulletin is sponsored by:

Rotary News

The recent detection of variant poliovirus type-2 isolates in environmental samples and the confirmation of a 10-month-old child who has contracted polio in Gaza is a stark reminder that as long as polio exists anywhere, it is a threat everywhere.

The ongoing crisis in Gaza has contributed to reduced routine immunization rates and an increased risk of vaccine-preventable diseases, including polio. The crisis also poses a significant challenge to fully implementing disease surveillance and vaccination campaigns.

The World Health Organization (WHO) considers there to be a high risk for the spread of this polio strain within Gaza and internationally, particularly given the current situation's impact on public health services.

A humanitarian pause allowed a two-round polio vaccination campaign to begin in Gaza. The first round was successfully implemented from 1-12 September 2024 and vaccinated 559,161 children, or an estimated 95% of eligible children at the governorate level, according to independently conducted post-campaign monitoring.

The second round of the emergency polio vaccination campaign in Gaza began on 14 October. The campaign started in Central Gaza, vaccinating children under ten years old with nOPV2, where children aged between 2-9 years old were also offered Vitamin A.

Rotary committed US\$500,000 to bolster the initiative, channeling these funds through a dedicated Polio Outbreak Response Fund. This contribution represents Rotary's sustained support to the WHO in combating polio globally.

Rotary will continue to work with its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative and other agencies as vaccination efforts unfold. Financial contributions to the PolioPlus fund will help Rotary and its Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners achieve a world in which no child is paralyzed by polio again
