## Speaker 4/25/25 - Nick Vlattas



Nicholas E. Vlattas was born in Newport News, Virginia, on October 26, 1952, to parents Emmanuel and Anne Vlattas. He has one sister, Maria. He is a Christian and a lifelong member of Saints Constantine & Helen Greek Orthodox Church, where he has served in many capacities, including Parish Council President, Sunday School Teacher, Greek Festival Steering Committee, and in Missions, Stewardship, and Finance Ministries. His Greek heritage traces back to his grandparents who immigrated to the U.S. in the early 1900s.

He attended elementary school at Saint Andrews and Hidenwood Elementary School and graduated from Ferguson High School in 1970. Nick went on to

study at Virginia Tech, where he earned a Bachelor of Architecture degree in 1976 and met the love of his life, Barbara Burgin Vlattas. After dating throughout college, they married in 1977, settled in Newport News, and later designed and built their home in Yorktown. They have two children: Kristen,

who married David Wickre, and Nicholas, who married Kelsey Kool. Nick and Barbara are proud grandparents of Eleni, age 14, and Andrew, age 4.

In 1979, Nick co-founded the architectural firm Hanbury Wright Vlattas + Company, where he served as Chief Operations Officer and Treasurer. The firm has grown to 164 employees with eight offices nationwide. After more than 40 years of service, Nick retired from the firm on February 1, 2019. During his career, he served as President of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Coastal Virginia Chapter and AIA Virginia. In 2019, he was honored to be invested into the College of Fellows of the American Institute of Architects—AIA's highest membership honor—held by less than 3% of its 100,000 members.

After retirement and a bucket-list trip to the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York, Nick was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer on September 17, 2019. Thanks to God, the talents and knowledge of doctors and healthcare teams at Johns Hopkins Hospital, Riverside Regional Medical Center, and TPMG —and the prayers and support of family and friends—he will celebrate the fifth anniversary of his Whipple surgery to remove the cancer on April 27, 2025. It was the first of three major surgeries.

Nick has loved baseball since childhood and has long been a fan of the Baltimore Orioles. Formerly a Baltimore Colts fan, he is now a Ravens supporter and remains passionate about football, especially his alma mater, Virginia Tech. He attends most home football games at his happy place—Lane Stadium. Nick also loves golf and has attended seven of The Masters tournaments.

His interests include intensive Bible study through weekly involvement in Bible Study Fellowship. He also serves on the Board of Directors for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at Virginia Tech and in the New River Valley. Since retiring, Nick has taken up gardening and cooking as new hobbies.

He is a charter member of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point and has maintained perfect attendance since its founding in 1984. Nick deeply values the fellowship and the "Service Above Self" motto of both the club and Rotary International.




