


Charter Night is Friday, January 31st - Breakfast at Warwick Restaurant

Volunteers can choose a shift or help all day:

- 1st shift is 7am to 10am

Volunteers will be loading and counting cases of cookies into volunteer vehicles and must be:

- 15 years or older (minors must have their caregiver's permission)
- Prepared to work the entire shift selected
- · Able to lift at least 30 pounds
- Able to be on their feed for at least 3 hours

Additional information:

- We'll provide water and snacks, but we recommend bringing your own water bottle as well
- Volunteers will receive a participation letter; the letter will be generally addressed ("Dear Volunteer") with a blank space for volunteer hours
- Volunteers will receive a box of Girl Scout cookies when checking out
