Casey Roberts is Executive Director of *New Horizons*.

New Horizons Regional Education Centers (NHREC) are operated by the Virginia Peninsula's school divisions as the Commonwealth's oldest and largest multi-campus regional education organization.

New Horizons opened its doors as *Virginia Peninsula Vocational Technical Center* in 1965. It is owned and operated by the six Peninsula School Divisions (Gloucester, Hampton, Newport News, Poquoson, Williamsburg/JCC, and York). As the largest of the nine regional centers in the state of Virginia in both size and scope of service. The centers include:

Family Counseling Centers- located on four sites:

The *Woodside Lane Campus* resides on 20 acres. The *WL Career and Technical Education Center* is a 75,000 sq. ft. bldg., and the *WL Special Education Center* is a 52,000 sq. ft. bldg.

Kiln Creek is a 15,000 sq. ft. integrated wing at *Kiln Creek Elementary School*

York Middle School is a 8,800 sq. ft. wing at *York Middle School*
