On February 25, President Lillian Boyd and I were treated to a zoom discussion on the Black experience in Rotary. Todd Jenkins hosted 4 young Rotarians from 4 different parts of the world to talk about their experiences. There was someone from The United Kingdom, Brazil, Nigeria and New York. Each participant was asked to respond to the same questions based on their experience as a Black person growing up in different parts of the world.

1. When did you first recognize you were black?
2. What has been your black experience in Rotary?
3. What advice do you have for people who want to build authentic relationships with people from different social identities?
4. Why is it important to make space for people to bring their full authentic selves (inclusive of all identities) to the Club?

The Role of White Rotarians?

1. Recognize that whites historically have access, control, power and wealth. It is incumbent upon those members to educate themselves and learn all they can about diversity.
2. Share what is learned.
3. Get involved in worthy causes; ie, protests, marches, advocacy.
4. Run for office. Elevate black voices. Is diversity apparent on your Board? In your schools? In the curriculum?

Rotarians Take Action

1. Be curious.
2. Be intentional....commit yourself.
3. Be engaged in service projects and grants.
4. Be an example...share information, lead, BE IT !
5. When you see an inappropriate behavior, what do you do?
