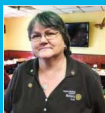

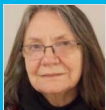

ictionaries were ordered so that each 3rd grader has his or her own personal dictionary. It is theirs forever. Each classroom teacher also gets a copy of the same dictionary so that he or she can assign and monitor usage of the dictionary as part of classroom assignments.

The dictionary was approved by the school administration and contains various types of information, such as multiplication tables (bring back memories?), a

braille sampler, sign language alphabet, and the longest word in the English language. No we won't repeat it here.

Teams of 6 -8 Rotarians visit each school by appointment to distribute the dictionaries to the 3rd grade classrooms.
