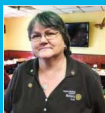

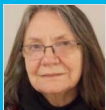

Officer Sam was the Employee of the month in November 2018 and Sansa is replacing Coal, her father, so he can enjoy his retirement.

Women Leaders in the Making - Girl Scouts

Jill Corrigan-Magruder, Unit Services Director for the Girl Scouts in Prince George, Ft. Lee, and Sussex County, spoke to the club on September 4th about her 35 years of involvement with Girl Scouts and her experiences helping build strong female leaders. Girl Scouts are heavily involved in service activities and involvement with other service organizations. She noted some of their more memorable projects ... collecting foodstuffs for victims of hurricanes, reading programs with the Prince George and other Libraries, Fire Safety training for kiddos, and sewing coffee at the Pentagon on 9/11. Girl Scouts are federally funded, but sell their cookies to provide for learning excursions and trainings. Community professionals are often brought in to share information about their careers and areas of interest. As Girl Scouts learn from these people, it helps shape their own horizons. She has known Girl Scouts who have become veterinarians, doctors, lawyers, police officers, and entrepreneurs. Jill noted that her daughter was the recipient of the first Earl Hale Rotary College Scholarship.

The annual Dictionary Project is a joint project of the club's Charitable Foundation and of the Prince George Rotary Club. This year over 550 dictionaries were ordered so that each 3rd grader has his or her own personal dictionary. It is theirs forever. Each classroom teacher also gets a copy of the same dictionary so that he or she can assign and monitor usage of the dictionary as part of classroom assignments.

The dictionary was approved by the school administration and contains various types of information, such as multiplication tables (bring back memories?), a braille sampler, sign language alphabet, and the longest word in the English language. No we won't repeat it here.

Teams of 6 -8 Rotarians visit each school by appointment to distribute the dictionaries to the 3rd grade classrooms.
