The TRF invests our gifts to the Annual Fund for three years and returns a portion to District 7600 in District Designated Funds, designated for district grants or global grants. **Over the last five years an average of 36 District 7600 Clubs each year have invested over a million dollars of DDF in local projects in our communities.**

County representatives will be invited for the dedication and photo opportunity. Refreshments will be served. Literacy and basic education are one of Rotary's seven causes. This will be the club's second Little Free Library. The first is at Bexely Mobile Home Community.

The Bexeley Little Free Library is supported with donations of books from members and from the Appomattox Regional Library System and is stocked by Past President Chana Amaro. In addition to books, various non-perishable food stuffs are also put into the Little Free Library. Anonymous donors have often let various food donations, as well.
