AFA2JB spoke to the club on the 6th

This article is a reprint from our December 7, 2023, club newsletter. It is reprinted as many folks seemed to have missed it earlier. We appreciated Bill's willingness to share his expertise with us.



AFA2JB,k also known to us as Rotarian Bill Gandel, spoke to the club on December 6th, about amateur or ham radio communications. Bill covered the history and importance of amateur radio operators in the county, citing times during hurricane or other emergencies when ham radio operators provided the only telecommunications in the region. Bill's personal interest began when he was too young to get his own operator's license, but fibbed and got it anyway. He was only 13 at the time. He explained to the club that certain types of radios are impervious to sunspot activity, which can play havoc with other forms of communication. He reported that there are 400 licensed amateur radio operators in the

county, but that only about 100 are active. There are 2 million licensed operators in the United States. Bill offered to be a resource for anyone who wishes to learn more about becoming a licensed amateur radio operator. President Cynthia
