The TRF invests our gifts to the Annual Fund for three years and returns a portion to District 7600 in District Designated Funds, designated for district grants or global grants. **Over the last five years an average of 36 District 7600 Clubs each year have invested over a million dollars of DDF in local projects in our communities.**

Volunteer Opportunity for Interact: We have a volunteer opportunity to support our Interact Club beginning March 23 and for five more Saturdays thereafter. The Prince George High School Interact Club, as a fundraiser, have been approved by the school administration to operate the concession stand at the soccer games on Saturdays. However, there must always be an adult present to supervise and look after the Interactors. Each of the six Saturdays will require a 5-hour commitment. Sasha Reynolds, our Youth Services Chair, would like to hear from you if you can devote your service to one of the six Saturdays. She advised that there would need to be a background check. We anticipate hearing more about this opportunity from Sasha soon.



Build and Installation Project - Little Free Library: With a grant from the club's foundation we will be constructing and installing another Rotary Free Little Library at one of our Mobile Home Communities. Bill Johnson has volunteered to assemble the Little Free Library kit with assistance from club members and the club will coordinate a date to have the installation and grand opening. County representatives will be invited for the dedication and photo opportunity. Refreshments will be served. Literacy and basic education are one of Rotary's seven causes. This will be the club's second Little Free Library. The first is at Bexley Mobile Home Community.

The Bexley Little Free Library is supported with donations of books from members and from the Appomattox Regional Library System and is stocked by Past President Chana Amaro. In addition to books, various non-perishable food stuffs are also put into the Little Free Library. Anonymous donors have often let various food donations, as well.

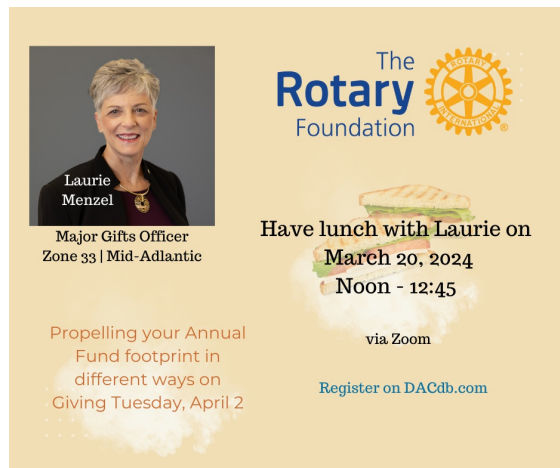

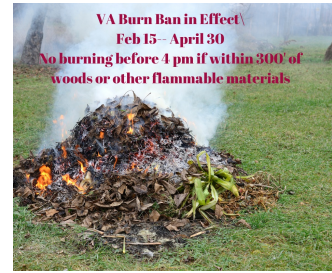
