Yellow School Buses Roll in PG County

Each year about this time as the yellow school buses start to roll, I am reminded of so many things in the past...my years in Prince George schools (grades 1-11), my career in public education and lastly, my mom's quest for school transportation for African-American ("colored") children in Prince George.



My family lived between State Route 10 and the ferry to Charles City, now the Benjamin Harrison Bridge crossing. Getting to any school was a long walk or still quite a trek via horse & wagon; nevertheless, my older siblings managed to make their way to school on most days. This is the Prince George School that I attended from grades 1 through 7, Harrison Grove Elementary School, which now sits on the corner of Merchant's Hope and Hall Farm Roads.

While there was some form of school transportation in Prince George, there was none for the "colored" kids. In 1937, my mom sought to remedy that by writing a letter to her favorite US President, Franklin D. Roosevelt. As a result of that letter, a

bus ("of sorts"...a bit dilapidated, with a hole in the floor) was presented to the segregated schools with my oldest brother as its first driver. The condition of the bus and whether it was the actual one sent by the President was always a source of family speculation.

By the time I attended the segregated schools in the County, there several yellow school buses, but I will always remember how that **first** yellow school bus for "colored" kids came about, back in the late 1930s





Bunks across America is a day organized by SHP for communities nationwide to get together to build beds for children who don't have beds to sleep in.

SHP will provide all the tools, safety equipment, and instructions on the build process as well. There is no age limit for family members, but young children will need to be supervised. Only experienced adults will be using the miter saws. All volunteers are

required to complete an online waiver in order to participate. There will be QR codes and paper copies to make the sign-in process as quick as possible.

There is ample parking on site as well as restrooms. Volunteers are encouraged to bring some water and snacks if needed. They can take breaks as needed. Volunteers should dress for the temperature, bring work gloves, and wear closed-toed shoes.
