From among those clubs who are selected as Governor's Circle Award recipients, a club that demonstrates an outstanding level of achievement is selected to receive the Governor's Cup. having achieved truly exceptional results during the year.

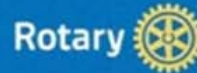
