Rotary believes in developing the next generation of leaders. Our programs help younger leaders build leadership skills, expand education and learn the value of service. The District supports:

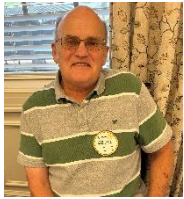
-Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills and learn about the world through service projects and activities.

JonDarr Bradshaw, a member of the Rotary E-Club of World Peace, D5330, is a former military aviator and contractor for the U.S. space agency, has a different kind of mission now: mentoring the next generation of scientists and engineers, especially youth from underserved neighborhoods. This U.S. Rotarian has worked with young people from urban neighborhoods for two decades. Many of them now work in science, Bradshaw grew up fascinated by science and technology through watching his father, an air traffic controller, and his mother, a biology teacher. Bradshaw's father was one of the few nonwhite people in his profession, and Bradshaw found himself in the same situation early in his own career at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. JonDarr Bradshaw, community engagement coordinator at the Great Lakes Science Center in Cleveland, Ohio, USA, mentors a team of high school robotics students with an interest in humanitarian projects.

Helping NASA continue that has been a big part of Bradshaw's work for more than two decades, as he finds young people from backgrounds that have been traditionally underrepresented in science and engineering and gotten them interested in those topics. His bosses at NASA were partly motivated by the desire to increase diversity, but also to overcome what they perceived as a shrinking pool of qualified candidates to carry on the agency's mission.
