PDG Bern Zeavin, 1926-2022

It is with a sorrowful heart that I report that Past President and Past District Governor Bern Zeavin died peacefully at home on Tuesday, 25 Oct 2022. Bern was one of the original members of BXRC, the club's first president in 1977 and DG in 1984. Bern was a groundbreaking doctor, Army officer, world traveler, and a champion ballroom dancer. A memorial service will be held at Bethel Hebrew Congregation on Friday, 28 Oct at 4PM. A graveside service will be held at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date. Today's Speaker: The Rev. Dr. Francis H. Wade, Culmore Clinic

Culmore Clinic is an interfaith, nonprofit healthcare clinic offering medical care, counseling, and specialty referrals to low-income adults in the Bailey's Crossroads community. The Rev. Dr. Francis H. Wade is a graduate of The Citadel and the Virginia Theological Seminary who has served as an Episcopal priest since 1966. After serving congregations in his native West Virginia for seventeen years, he was called as Rector of St. Alban's Parish adjacent to the Washington National Cathedral. He served that congregation from 1983 until his retirement in 2005. After serving on the Special Commission on the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion, he served as co-chair for the General Convention special committee focusing on Episcopal – Anglican relations. He is an adjunct faculty member at Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria and has taught Pastoral Theology at both General and Virginia Seminaries. In 2012 he served as Interim Dean of Washington National Cathedral. In 2013 he received an honorary doctorate from The Virginia Seminary. He served as Interim Dean of Students at that seminary in the 2016-2017 academic year.

Upcoming Speaker: 4 Nov, DG Sheila

Sheila was born and raised in Chicago, the 3rd oldest of 10 and one of six twins in the family – soon to be eight. Sheila started working for the Federal Government the day after she graduated high school and has not stopped since. She and her late husband moved to VA in 1983 for job transfers. Sheila's career was Human Resources Management. In 1985 she was asked to put a box on everyone's desk. Took her two days to figure out the box was a computer. 39 ½ years later she retired after automating several HR lines of business around the world for DoD, USDA, Forest Service, and DEA. Her leadership in the Federal Government shaped her life skills. This career taught her loyalty, respect, protocol, the value of friendship, the value of volunteering, being humble, the value of life, the power of prayer, it's ok to make a mistake, own it when you do it, teamwork, and more. She met her current husband in 2013 who introduced her to the Rotary Club of Vienna. Since joining the club, Sheila has held several positions including President. Sheila joined Rotary to make a difference. It is what we do, who we are, the impact we have in our communities, around the Globe, and in ourselves. Sheila is "THAT" Rotarian who believes and lives the Four-Way Test 24/7/365. She will be a Rotarian the rest of her life!

Calendar Call: 20 Nov, BXRC Honored at Hidden Oaks Nature Center

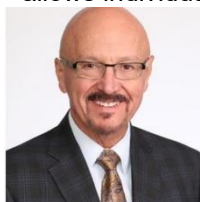

Virginia Unclaimed Property Program

Virginia's consumer protection law requires businesses to turn unclaimed property over to the state, relieving the business of the financial liability. Virginia holds unclaimed property as the custodian until the rightful owner, or heir, files a claim. Unclaimed property can be dormant or inactive accounts such as securities or investments, bank accounts, unpaid wages, money from insurance policies, tangible property, etc. Since this program was created in 1961, over \$1 billion in unclaimed property has been returned to citizens. To claim your unclaimed property, go to www.VaMoneySearch.gov. This website allows individuals to search the Commonwealth's unclaimed property database and begin the claim process immediately.



Don Wellen Laid to Rest
