Frankie left her homeland for France, learned its language, and applied to several organizations for work. Then, lo and behold, the World Bank went looking for her. Yes, quality sometimes rises to the top. She was offered a two-month contract, which eventually lasted for five years. She participated in the bank's human relations, conflict mediation, and more, and was involved in sanitation, energy, transportation and finance projects. It was an enormous learning experience. She was a young, black lady traveling frequently to difficult countries such as Afghanistan.

Then came COVID. Working from home, she had to learn the technology and keep up with changes in the structure of the bank. She soon realized that, before COVID, she had been away from home about **fourteen hours a day**. Why go back to that? Soon after, she resigned and was given a going-away party, on a boat, no less. She turned in her badge, cell phones, computers, etc. and woke up on the first day of retirement with no bells or buzzers. She could literally feel her blood pressure dropping.
