### **Rotary Heroes Recognition Brunch - April 23, 2023**

Scott Chaney, FFII/EMT-B Riviera Beach Volunteer Fire Co.

Congratulations to Firefighter and EMT Scott Chaney from Reviera Beach Volunteer Fire Company, who was awarded Firefighter of the year sponsored by the Rotary Club of Lake Shore-Severna Park.





While many hear the call to duty before joining the volunteer fire service, Scott Chaney's entrance into volunteering was less traditional. Like every child who sees a fire truck racing down the street, he too was mesmerized, but he never imagined himself being the one on the engine or running headfirst into the fire. However, when the opportunity presented itself, Scott took it. And though it was complete happenstance that he started this journey, he committed himself to it and gave the same level of dedication that he does with everything else in life. He is a proud father, son, brother, tradesman, and firefighter.





Scott is no stranger to working hard or

getting dirty. As a Traffic Systems Supervisor, he's spent the last thirteen years working with his hands and utilizing his skills to lead a team of lineman through various jobsites as the unsung heroes of Baltimore and the surrounding areas. In January of 2020, he had the chance to step into what is seen as a more traditional "hero" role when he was brought into the Riviera Beach Volunteer Fire Company. Unbeknownst to him, the Covid-19 pandemic was looming over the horizon. As a result, Scott couldn't complete his training until August of the following year, but he stuck with it wholeheartedly and waited patiently. It was an obstacle that he overcame so he could truly start what he set out to do. In the midst of his training, Scott learned he was going to become a father, but it only added fuel to his fire. His daughter is one of the biggest motivations for him to push harder, do more, and be the best person he can be. It's important to him to be an example and set high expectations of himself so he can make her as proud as she makes him. He supports her in everything she does, even at such a young age, and understands that she has her own path in life, but he intends to be there every step of the way.

Having his daughter brought about a new challenge in which he had to learn to balance his time between raising her, working, maintaining time for himself, and completing his fire training, but he did it with an unparalleled level of sophistication that received recognition within the firehouse. Once he completed Fire I and EMT training, he quickly became a wellknown figure as someone who was dependable and eager to help.

After feeling the rush of racing to a scene and making memories of aiding those in need, Scott soon completed Fire II in February of 2022. He wanted to expand his knowledge of fire safety and add to his experiences, but he – not so secretly – made it his goal to be on the ladder truck too. He also aspires to be an officer, so he will be adding Fire Officer Training to his arsenal in the near future. This will give him an opportunity to bring the leadership skills he's developed through his personal job into the volunteer world. His passion for bettering the company isn't limited to the operational side of volunteering. In addition to being an active and avid riding member, Scott was voted onto the board of directors in November of 2022, and this is a position he still currently holds. He is also the chairperson of both the Membership and Building & Grounds Committees, as well as a new member of the Cadet Committee. He has repeatedly shown his value and expects very little in return: respect for the job, compassion for those in need, and resilience as a team. There is undoubtedly a bright future ahead for Scott Chaney, filled with greatness and everything else he sets his mind on.
