Disaster Relief Aid - Maui Fire

You may be aware that the wildfire on the Hawaiian island of Maui is the deadliest U.S. wildfire in more than a century. The death toll is still rising and the entire town of historic Lahaina has been burnt to the ground, displacing thousands of people. Currently, more than 1,000 people remain missing.

Our District 7620 Disaster Relief Committee is raising funds to help the victims of this disaster. Although you have multiple options to help the victims, the Committee recommends that you (individually or as a club) send your monetary donations to Disaster Aid USA (DAUSA), a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, co-founded by Past District Governor Bob Grill. The Committee works with DAUSA on all domestic disasters including Hurricanes, Tornadoes, and Floods. The Committee, in coordination with DAUSA, had previously sent 50 blue tents by DAUSA to Maui and the Big Island two years ago to address a flood disaster. Therefore, there is an already established relationship with Rotary's PDG Ron Mabry of Hawaii.

So, all disaster aid for the Maui Fire will be coordinated through the Rotary family. Your donations to DAUSA are tax-deductible. Please note, however, that all District 7620 member contributions are considered personal or club donations, and will not be associated with annual giving to The Rotary Foundation.
