Wheelchairs for Ghana

Some members of our club will continue to attend meeting and is provide non-financial support for a global grant for wheelchairs led by the Rotary Club of Mt. Airy, Maryland, which plans to obtain commitment from a dozen district clubs. Expected budget is \$60,000 (clubs + District + TRF) to support 100 beneficiaries. Rotary Club of ACCRA-South (Ghana) is the host club. Rotary Twin Club Relationships

The membership committee developed guidelines for the establishment of twin club relationships. Twin clubs, sometimes called sister clubs, are two clubs from different countries that form a long-term relationship to promote international understanding and goodwill. These twin relationships could be with another Rotary, Rotaract, or Interact club.

The Rotary Club of Capitol Hill has updated its bylaws to include information on twinning clubs. Members can propose a twining club arrangement with other international clubs. The RCCH board voted on April 11th to pilot the twining club concept with a Rotary Club in Morocco. Signing of the twinning club certificate between the two clubs was signed in June and coordinated by club secretary **Eli Missour**, the lead of this effort who currently lives in Morocco.

FOUR-WAY TEST



The Four-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943, but it had been around since 1932 when Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor coined it when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy.

This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.
