

Rotary Twin Club Relationships

These twin relationships could be with another Rotary, Rotaract, or Interact club.

The Rotary Club of Capitol Hill has updated its bylaws to include information on twinning clubs. Members can propose a twining club arrangement with other international clubs. The RCCH board voted on April 11th to pilot the twining club concept with a Rotary Club in Morrocco. Signing of the twinning club certificate between the two clubs will be coordinated by club secretary **Eli Missour**, the lead of this effort who currently lives in Morrocco.





FOUR-WAY TEST



The Four-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943, but it had been around since 1932 when Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor coined it when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy.

This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.
