Transforming Lives One Bicycle at a Time

The Rotary Club of Carroll Creek's 18th annual Community Bicycle Collection on Saturday, April 20th netted 108 used-yet-serviceable bicycles and two sewing machines for Rockville, Maryland-based Bikes For The World. Over the past eighteen years the Carroll Creek Rotary Club has collected and shipped over 6,800 bicycles to developing regions of the world, fulfilling one of Rotary's Areas of Focus - Community and Economic Development.

Bicycles and sewing machines collected will be packed in ocean-worthy shipping containers bound for ports on the continent of Africa, where NGO partners of Bikes For The World will recondition the bikes and distribute them for affordable transportation to school, healthcare and employment.

In Memoriam: Past District Governor Dr. John L. Sever

It is with sadness that I share news of the passing of Past District Governor Dr. John Sever of the Rotary Club of Potomac. Dr. Sever was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois, and joined Rotary in 1964 in Potomac, Maryland. He served as Club President from 1969-1970, and was our District Governor during Rotary Year 1978-1979

As many of you may know, Dr. Sever is widely known as the Father of the Polio Initiative. His contributions to eradicating the disease have been immeasurable. Dr. Sever is known world-wide for his work with infectious diseases, and also Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology.

Dr. Sever was married. He and his beautiful wife, Gerane, raised three daughters together; Kimberly, Beverly and Valerie. The funeral will held on June 1 at 3pm at Ingleside at King Farm, 701 King Farm Blvd., Rockville. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to the Rotary Polio Plus Program.
