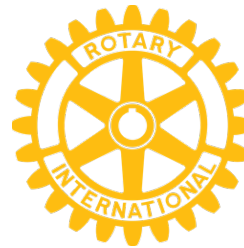

A peace pole is a monument that displays the message "May Peace Prevail on Earth" in the language of the country where it has been placed. The idea of peace poles was first thought up by Masahisa Goi in 1955 in Japan. The first peace poles outside Japan were constructed in 1983. Since then, more than 200,000 have been placed around the world in close to 200 countries.

"Let us celebrate this momentous occasion together and renew our commitment to building a more peaceful future for all," concluded Dr. Kahn.
