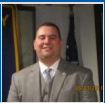

SEPTEMBER 12, 2022 MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Fellow Rotarians,

September's Rotary Theme is Basic Education and Literacy. Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair, Ian H.S. Riseley, reports in his September Rotary Magazine message that there are an estimated 773 million illiterate adults, mostly women. Many in the United States and in our Communities are part of those 773 million.

Rotary's goal is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education, and increase adult literacy. We support education for all children and literacy for children and adults. Rotary works to achieve that goal by Mentoring Students, Teacher Training, and Fighting Adult Literacy.

An example of Mentoring Students is the mentoring program that the Rotary Club of St. Joseph & Benton Harbor started a decade ago – a program that has helped more than 400 local high school students learn more about their dream careers by connecting them with professionals in those fields.

The exposure to community service that the program provides has led students to start [Interact clubs](#) at six local schools, including one at St. Joseph High School that has about 150 members.

An example of Fighting Adult Literacy are Rotary members in the United States who partnered with ProLiteracy Detroit to recruit and train tutors after a study showed that more than half of the local adult population was functionally illiterate. 500 adults raised their reading levels by three grades in Detroit.

Can your club think of a project that would help achieve Rotary's goal? Might you partner with other clubs or community partners?

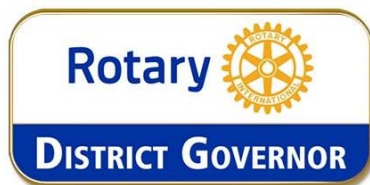
