Annual winter coat drive kicks off Sept. 29

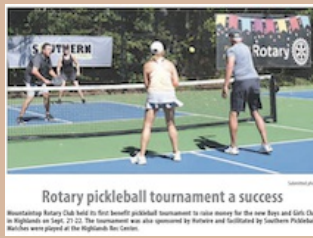

THE PLUS IN POLIOPLUS





Musa Muhammed Ali, a farmer in Borno state, Nigeria, has had to deal with the many ways polio has affected his life. For instance, he used to have to pay for transportation when he needed to buy feed for his animals. But after receiving a hand-operated tricycle funded through Rotary's PolioPlus grants, Ali can now spend that money on other necessities. His life was changed by the "plus" in PolioPlus.

When we talk about PolioPlus, we know we are eradicating polio, but do we realize how many added benefits the program brings? The "plus" is something else that is provided as a part of the polio eradication campaign. It might be a hand-operated tricycle or access to water. It might be additional medical treatment, bed nets, or soap. A 2010 study estimates that vitamin A drops given to children at the same time as the polio vaccine have prevented 1.25 million deaths by decreasing susceptibility to infectious diseases.

ROTARY PROJECTS AROUND THE WORLD - AUSTRALIA



Rotary clubs in Australia have many projects, including those that focus on children, mental health, and the environment:

Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC)

Provides life-saving surgeries for children from South Pacific countries, such as Timor Leste, PNG, Solomon

Island, and Vanuatu.

- **Protecting children's vision**

A consortium of Rotary clubs and districts raised funds for a mobile diagnostic imaging platform for the Children's Hospital at Westmead.

- **Peacebuilding and conflict prevention**

Rotary clubs raise awareness and funds to prevent domestic violence and support

its victims.

- **Check dams**

Rotary clubs in Australia and India collaborated to build check dams to control stormwater flow, decrease erosion, and increase water percolation into the ground.

- **Beecroft Spirit Gin**

The Rotary Club of Beecroft produced a gin infused with botanicals from the area, with proceeds going toward the renovation of an electrical substation and other projects.

- **Operation Cleft**

A project that has changed the lives of more than 7,600 children since 2005.

- **Safe Sanitation and Water Saves Lives (SSWSL)**

A program to supply clean water to people in underdeveloped countries.

- **End Hepatitis Now Project**

A partnership between Rotary Melbourne and Hepatitis Victoria.
