

Jim Davidson, who often sells raffle tickets at our meetings, won the raffle on April 27! Good for you, Jim!





May is Youth Service Month

Rotary believes in developing the next generation of leaders. Rotary's programs help younger leaders build leadership skills, expand education and learn the value of service. A few ways for youth to be involved include Interact clubs, Rotary Youth



Leadership Awards, Rotary Youth Exchange, and New Generations Service Exchange.

Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12 -18 to help develop and strengthen their leadership skills. These young leaders learn about the community through service projects and activities. Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, or RYLA, is a youth leadership program to help youth build their confidence, learn new skills and have fun while doing so. Rotary Youth Exchange builds peace one young person at a time. Rotary clubs from more than 100 countries sponsor students ages 15-19

and these students are able to learn new languages, discover new cultures and become global citizens.

Rotary has a long-standing commitment to serving our youth and will continue to commit to the development of these valuable individuals.
