### Pollinator Garden Dedication and Environmental/DEI Volunteer Opportunity

On Sat Apr 13th, The Rotary Club of Asheville will celebrate that Rotary shares an interest in

protecting our common legacy: the environment. We are committed to supporting activities that strengthen the conservation and protection of natural resources, advance ecological sustainability, and foster harmony between communities and the environment.

We'll start at the Rotary Pavillion at Carrier Park on Amboy Rd at 9:30 am and will recognize the accomplishments of the club in the creation of a pollinator garden. This project has been a year-long effort in collaboration with GreenWorks and the City of Asheville, and we'll dedicate the space with a sign.

Then we'll head over to the historic Asheville



<u>SouthSide Community</u> and team up with **RiverLink** foreducation and some light hands-on work focused on stormwater and community beautification. Starting around 10am, this will culminate the 9-month project with RiverLink that included a district grant to help educate builders, landscape designers, and others on ways they project the French Broad Watershed. That course was developed to be taught in cooperation with Green Built Alliance and recognizes our clubs' contributions to make it possible.

### **Helpmate Update**



April Burgess-Johnson has worked to end domestic violence for 29 years. She currently serves as Executive Director at Helpmate in Buncombe County, NC where she has helped lead tremendous community change work that has resulted in tripling the number of survivors served over the last decade. Prior to her work at Helpmate, April worked at the North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence and was involved in several projects, including development and support for coordinated community response teams, primary prevention, training/technical assistance and executive management. Preceding her work at NCCADV, April was a Rape and Sexual Assault Advocate, Shelter Manager, and Executive Director in domestic violence and sexual assault programs in NC and was the Central Region Director at the NC Council for Women/Domestic Violence Commission.
