The guest speaker will be Jennifer Bauer, the co-owner and principal geologist for Appalachia Landslide Consultants (ALC). ALC's mission is to help protect life and property by identifying landslide hazards. Jenn Bauer began her engineering geology career in 2001, and in 2005, began specializing in landslides and landslide mapping. She became a licensed geologist in 2005 in N.C., and is also licensed in TN. and GA. Jennifer graduated with highest honors in Geology from UNC-Chapel Hill and is a past President of the Association of Environmental and Engineering Geologists (AEG). And most important of all, Jenn is a fellow Rotarian and past president of the Rotary Club of Asheville-South. She'll speak to us about the landslide impacts of Hurricane Helene and what this means going forward for our region.

Beloved Asheville Outing

Beloved Asheville

As part of District 7670's disaster relief efforts, DG Connie Molland was able to arrange for the delivery of a trailer containing a water filtration system to Verner School of Early Learning. It can filter up to 20,000 gallons of water per day. It will provide potable water for at least 300 families and will allow Verner to begin using its kitchen for cooking.

It all began when DG Connie was contacted by her Governor classmate DG Kelsey Mitchell from District 6960 in Southwest Florida to see if she could make use of the trailer. The trailer had been shuttled up to

Tennessee and was scheduled to be returned when Kelsey called Connie. The Rotarians using the trailer in Tennessee, arranged for it to be delivered to the home of Dave Mans. Steve and Gina Schmitt (who are not Rotarians) had been on a retreat there and were kind enough to bring it to Dave on their way home to Lake Norman. Dave then had the honor of delivering it to Verner and was met by Jessica May, Verner Vice President of Philanthropy & Marketing.



In order to easily access and distribute the filtered



water, Our Club has received a \$10,000 Disaster Relief Grant and will purchase the necessary water bags from KRW Packaging Machinery, Inc. Verner will be holding its first water distribution event with the newly filtered water on Wednesday, October 23rd.
