Last Week's Program - May 18, 2023

Dr. Rob Jackson, Buncombe County School System Superintendent, was our speaker last week.

A graduate of the local school system, he recently returned home to take this position. His presentation was an overview of his "First 100 Days."

Dr. Jackson first met one-on-one with a range of school system workers. The strengths they identified are the students, the teachers, and the progress of the literacy program. Currently, the arts programs, orchestra programs, and the kid's athletic successes stand out. They identified these areas to focus on:

- · Mental health support
- · Staff retention
- Newcomer language student needs--Both Ukrainian and Hispanic

Dr. Jackson's previous experience in school system positions ranges from custodian, to teacher, to principal, and now, to this one--his second superintendent position. So, he brings a broad perspective to address these needs. And he shines as a star of the Buncombe County School System


