Rotary International seven areas of focus:

Mayan Melipona Honey Bees and their Women Bee Tenders of the Yucatán Mexico. We are an environmental and a cultural project with a solution based mission to increase populations of this endangered Mayan Honeybee while at the same time preserving and documenting ancient Mayan Beekeeping traditions that are being lost. Rebecca Ann Robertson is the Director of MayanMeliponaBee.org. She is a veteran bee tender and a member of $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ Asheville Rotary Club $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$. She is also on the Leadership Committee of BEECITY USA/ Asheville and a board member of $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ Center for HoneyBee Research "in Asheville NC

The Mayan Melipona Bee Sanctuary Project was conceptualized by Rebecca Robertson after she was invited to travel with the Asheville Sister Cities Delegation in February 2020 to our SISTER CITY of Valladolid in the Yucatán, Mexico.

Her connection to the native stingless Melipona honey bees and their women beekeepers was immediate, as was her decision to find the means to help her beekeeping sisters to grow and thrive.
The Asheville Rotary Club has generously awarded a \$11,500 grant to The Mayan Melipona Bee Sanctuary Project (MMBSP) by the Rotary

Club of Asheville Foundation. This grant plus an anonymous donation from a Rotary Club member will allow us to expand by adding 3 more Bee Yards this year in the Yucatan México.

The Mayan Melipona Bee Sanctuary Project is a 501c3 non-profit organization.
