Hunter Marks is CEO of Watermark Landscape Architecture, a local company engaged in landscape architecture and land planning.

The Board Minute:

- Ad hoc Committee addressed Club Treasurer and Secretary duties and recommended succession plan for Treasurers and Secretaries starting this year.
- Two 2018-19 Community Leaders have been nominated for recognition at an upcoming club meeting.

- Board voted to support greenway expansion in the community, clearing the way for letters of support for grants as well as service projects.
- Fundraising team gearing up for the Golf Tournament May 10th.
- 2019-2020 Fundraising Committee to meet in May with our club's Charitable 501c3 Corporation to improve understanding and planning.
- Rotary baseball game social announced for July 19th at the Asheville Tourists, McCormick Field. The Club has reserved the Oscar Blues Party Pavilion.
- Board decided to support the community Walk to End Alzheimer's September 28th at Mills River Park.
