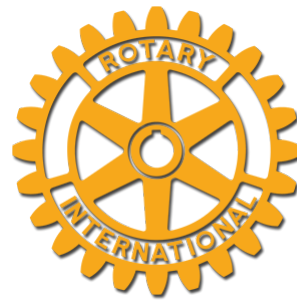

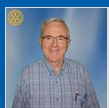

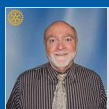

Make a Difference at RYLA

RYLA-Rotarian Coaches

Rotarian Coaches are selected Rotary members or Rotaracters who provide faculty support for Rotary Youth Leadership Academy.

Expectations/key functions:

- Coaches will directly support **Transformational Leadership**, allowing RYLA's Young Leaders to start where they are, explore new leadership skills, and develop their own style of leadership in a safe, supportive environment.
- Coaches will actively participate in orientation as scheduled prior to the event, and on opening day at 1:00 prior to opening of student registration. This will include an overview of the Program, discussion of role expectations, "RYLA Rules", and explanation/training for various small group discussions.
- Coaches will facilitate small group discussions and activities—listening and acting more as an orchestra conductor than an airline pilot; will support open and honest discussion by all students in a variety of group and individual settings. **(...facilitation usually requires a stretch of leadership skills in the "listening" department!)**
- Coaches may lead "Success Discussions". These interactive discussions will draw on professional experience to provide supportive information to young leaders. Otherwise, the role of the Coach is generally NOT to provide your own experiences or insight but to let the youth make these decisions on their own.
- Coaches will support and advance the development of Student Alumnae Group (SAG) Leaders when partnered with them. Students who may have the maturity, insight and skills to be asked to consider being SAG Leaders for the next year. Rotarian Coaches will also be asked for input/nomination of Rotaracters to be invited back to serve as Coaches.
- Coaches will actively participate in all planned activities, including sitting with students at most meals, meeting and walking with their group to meals and events, assigning roll call duties within their group, and assisting with chaperone/security duties. **Please note that some of the activities are very physical and there will be many daily up and down hill walks across campus. You will not be asked to participate in activities that you are not comfortable with.**
- Coaches will reside in the same dormitory as the students.

RECRUITING PROCESS

- POCs solicit members of their clubs to be coaches.
 - We expect to need 10 to 14 Rotarian coaches.
 - We will need some male and some female coaches.
- Interested candidates fill out application
 - Go to the District website, then RYLA tab, then RYLA for Rotarians to find an application.
 - Fill it in online
 - Print it
 - Sign it
 - Mail it to Mike Stevenson; 210 Joe Brown Rd, Mars Hill NC 28754
- Candidates' names will be added to a pool of interested Rotarians (Selection will be made when specific needs are known – probably February)
- Candidates will be invited to agree to a background check. THIS IS MANDATORY.
- Candidates must complete Rotary's online Youth Protection course. THIS IS MANDATORY.
