Where to Park for Paper Mill Lounge Lunch Meetings

Please see this map for recommended parking options.

If you are able to handle stairs, the easiest place to park is the First United Methodist Church's parking lot, then walk south on Jackson Street (behind City Lights Bookstore), then walk down a flight of stairs from Jackson Street to the pavilion at Paper Mill Lounge.

Or park in the church parking lot, then walk down the Spring Street sidewalk to Main Street, and then turn right and take the sidewalk on Main Street.

For anyone parking on Main Street, don't forget about the town's parking lot, shown here.

There is a short and slight incline to the pavilion once you get on the property. There is a wheelchair on premises. If you think you'll need that, please let Todd Vinyard know to coordinate it.

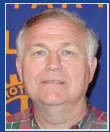

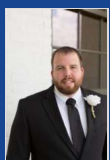
