Polio Case in Philippines

Statement from International PolioPlus Chair Michael K. McGovern on circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 case in the Philippines

Through ongoing disease surveillance, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative has confirmed a circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) case in a three-year-old girl in the Philippines, along with a possible second case pending confirmation from the World Health Organization. No cases of wild poliovirus have been discovered, and the Philippines polio-free status is not at risk.

We re saddened by this news and for the child, especially as Rotary approaches the 40-year anniversary of our first immunization project in the Philippines in 1979.

It is important to remember that cVDPVs are extremely rare and only occur in under-immunized communities. Vaccination coverage in the Philippines has been steadily declining over the past few years, and the case reported recently underscores how crucial it is to increase vaccination coverage to at least 95% of children to stop future spread of polio.

Rotary and our partners are working with counterparts and public health authorities in the Philippines to strengthen surveillance and support immunization responses in the coming weeks and months.

Rotary has a broad and active network in the Philippines a network that has the power to raise awareness about the importance of improving immunization rates and making sure every single child is protected against polio. On Friday, 20 September, the 10 District Governors in the Philippines signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Department of Health to work together to ensure the success of the upcoming polio immunization campaigns.

We appreciate the leadership and commitment of Rotarians in the Philippines to protect all children from polio in the country where Rotary held the inaugural polio immunization campaign.



Rise Against Hunger to help Bahamas-Sept 12 Update

A note from our RI Directors Stephanie & David:

You are all well aware of the tragedy Hurricane Dorian caused in the Bahamas. When tragedy met Haiti, Rotarians were immediately there, along with

everyone else, to assist. Within six months, almost everyone else was gone, but Rotary is still there for the long haul, developing and building a countrywide water system with our HANWASH project.

I expect that the same will be true in the Bahamas, expecially the Abacos,

which were devastated. We are currently not only raising money for relief, but Rotarians all over, especially in the Southeast, are rallying to the cause for supplies. The response is massive.

In talking with Past RI President Barry on Wednesday, in Nassau alon there are, or have enroute, over 11,000 refugees from Dorian who need shelter. Disaster housing is at capacity, and through Rotary, tents are coming in, and more buildings will be built and equipped. But FOOD will be an issue for some time to come. We already have over 400,000 prepackaged meals headed that way, but for 11,000 people at only two meals a day, that's less than 20 days of food.

Please consider a meal packaging event with the meals going to the Bahamas. Rise Against Hunger can help us coordinate the shipping of the meals through aggregating projects, but just getting the millions of meals needed in packages is our current challenge. ALL OF THESE MEALS WILL COUNT TOWARD OUR 10 MILLION MEAL CHALLENGE as well. You can get more information at their website and you can also make online donations HERE.
