

Jessica McKnight introduced Skip Carney to speak on the power of "How Might We". The 45 year Rotary vet, '09-'10 President, Paul Harris Fellow, and Benefactor is also Jessica's father. The one time Disc Jockey, turned voice over firm, turned full marketing entrepreneur brought greeting from District 7720 in Rocky Mount. As Skip talked about his myriad of Rotary Pins, he was a bit critical of the Mission that Rotary promotes. Every year, with every new R.I. President, Rotary adopts a new theme. It changes every year.

In this, his third book, he got our attention right off the bat when he said that 95% on business owners value innovation yet only 7% claim they are innovative. Innovation, according to Skip, is a "creative solution to a customer's problem'. To be successful, you must be driven by innovation. You must posses both Uniqueness (have what no one else has) and Value. When people sit down to discuss their strategies, they often ask yes/no questions. Can we do this? Should we do that? Instead he says, we should ask "How Might We"? How might we do this? How might we do that? What's stopping us from doing something? He said if you take nothing else away from here today, take that concept!

Skip explained his 'Idea Concept of Identify, Discover, Explore, and Activate. Many times, he said, committees (or companies0 are trying to solve the wrong problem. Their Revision program helps uncover problems whether it be operations, product/service issues, sales, or marketing.

He then turned to applying the same concepts to Rotary and membership. He mentioned there were not many 'gen-Z-ers' in the room. That generation doesn't hate Rotary, they just don't know it. It isn't engrained in them. They don't know the value. Including the would not only lower our average age, but with more people things should be more fun. It allows the opportunity to make more connections and make a bigger difference. So what is stopping us Skip asks. He suggests it is awareness. We have an image problem. There is not one thing we hang our hat on, unless possibly it is world peace. Is Rotary then just not cool? Is it relevant? Is our purpose too fuzzy? (cont. on page 5)

# WELL KNOWN POLIO OVERCOMERS: Polio to Heisman to General

Peter Miller Dawkins (born March 8, 1938) was diagnosed and treated for Polio at age 11. He was successfully treated with aggressive physical therapy and lived an active and even highly decorated life.



As a senior in 1958 he won the Heisman Trophy, the Maxwell Award, and was named as a consensus All-American. After graduating



from the Military Academy in 1959, he studied at the University of Oxford as a Rhodes Scholar. Dawkins served as an officer in the United States Army until he retired in 1983 with the rank of brigadier general. He is the last survivor of the 27 first Heisman Winners.

Dawkins graduated with a BSc from the Military Academy in 1959 with a very high class standing, and was awarded a Rhodes Scholarship. He earned a BA at Brasenose College, Oxford in 1962 in Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (promoted to an MA in 1968, per tradition) and later earned a Master of Public Affairs in 1970 and PhD in 1977 from the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University.



He is the only person in history to have held the titles of Brigade Commander, Football Team Captain, Class President, Star Man (top 5% of the class), Heisman Trophy winner, and Rhodes Scholar. He is often regarded as the most decorated cadet in the history of the United States Military.

He was a Republican candidate for United States Senate in 1988. Dawkins has held executive positions with Lehman Brothers, Bain & Company, Primerica, and Citigroup.
