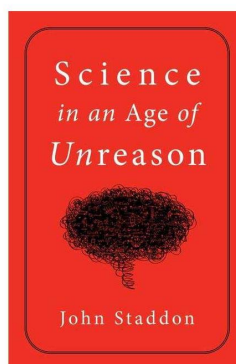

traumatic brain injury (TBI) while serving in Iraq. I am excited to announce that Homes For Our Troops is near completion of his custom home, right in your community!

Homes For Our Troops (HFOT) is a privately funded 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization that builds and donates specially adapted, custom homes nationwide for severely injured post 9/11 Veterans. Veterans choose the community where they wish to focus on recovery, and rebuilding their lives. Since inception in 2004, HFOT has built more than 330 homes in 42 states, with an additional 82 projects underway!

To celebrate, we will be hosting a very special event:

Volunteer Day- Bring your gardening tools and roll up your sleeves as we beautify the property around the home! All volunteers receive an HFOT t-shirt and lunch!

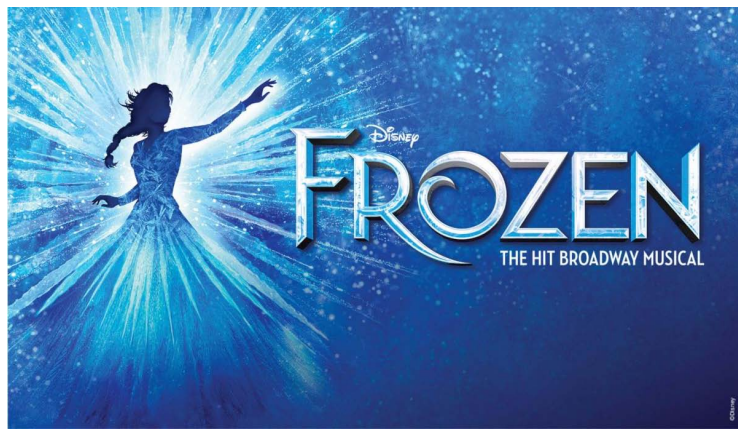
