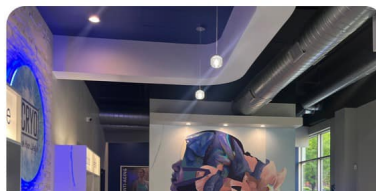

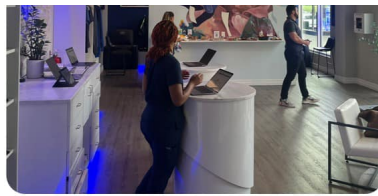

### **Rotary Club of Raleigh Forecast**

There is a chance for showers and thunderstorms today with high temperatures in the mid-80s and lows in the low 70s. Our first chance of tropical weather this season will arrive Tuesday evening as Tropical Storm Debby pushes some rain bands northward across our area. Debby is expected to make landfall along the Florida panhandle this morning before moving to the north to northeast across the southeast states. Over the NC Piedmont, rain and showers from Debby will continue through the remainder of the work week with total precipitation amounts through Friday of around 4-6". As of Sunday afternoon, the models are not in good agreement on the exact track of Debby once she makes landfall. One model shows the possibility that the center of the storm could cross central NC late Wednesday night into Thursday. If Debby does cross central NC, we could see wind gusts to around 30mph late Wednesday into early Thursday. These winds are below tropical storm strength but could be capable of blowing down small branches and dislodging loose objects. For the Raleigh area, the main threat will be excessive rainfall through Friday. Make sure to stay aware of the latest road conditions and never drive through flooding on a roadway. Keep an eye out for weather updates at NOAA's National Hurricane Center at <https://www.nhc.noaa.gov/> and NOAA's National Weather Service Raleigh office at <https://www.weather.gov/rah/>.
