Rotary Club of Raleigh Forecast

This week will bring some relief from the heat and a reprieve from daily downpours. An upper level ridge will wobble over the central US throughout this week with small disturbances riding eastward along it. This ridge will bring us cooler daytime temperatures. Monday looks to be the warmest day with high temperatures in the mid-80s and lows Monday night in the upper 60s. From Tuesday through the coming weekend, high temperatures will only climb into the low 80s with lows dropping into the mid-60s. Our diurnal temperature range (the difference between daytime highs and overnight lows) will remain between 15F to 20F meaning we will still be in a humid airmass. As some of the upper level disturbances move along the ridge, we could see afternoon showers and storms. The best chance for precipitation is Tuesday night and Saturday night. However, any day you could see a passing shower or storm, so keep an eye on the weather. Thunderstorms that do form are projected to be sub-warning/advisory level. You may have heard about another topical disturbance that is likely to reach tropical storm/hurricane strength in the next few days. This disturbance is currently near the equator and is projected to stay off the US coast and be pushed out to sea. It looks to be a pleasant weather week but remember to keep an eye on the weather in case a storm pops up near you.
