Rotary Friendship Exchange to Stockholm, Sweden June 15 - 22

Please see the note below from Liz LaBelle from the Cary Page Rotary Club about an upcoming Friendship Exchange in Sweden. For the mentioned itinerary and budget, contact Liz at singingbiz11@gmail.com.

This is a trip sponsored by the Cary Page Rotary Club, and our exchange club is the Osterakers Club in Akersberga, Sweden just north of Stockholm. At present we have 7 members of our club who have purchased airline tickets and provided deposits for the trip. Unfortunately, another couple had planned to participate, but were forced to drop out last week due to an injury. We would very much like to fill their spots in our group as reservations have already been made for a 2-night Baltic cruise to Tallinn, Estonia, and a charter bus day trip to the Rotary Peace Center at the University of Uppsala in Uppsala, Sweden. It is our hope that the participants in this year's exchange will host Swedish Rotarians and spouses next year. However, it is not a requirement for participation.

I'm attaching a preliminary itinerary and budget for our week-long event. Host families in Akersberga have already been secured, and at present we have an empty spot for a couple. Everyone is expected to bear the cost of their own travel to/from Stockholm (Arlanda Airport) as well as ground transportation to the Radisson Blu Waterfront Hotel in downtown, Stockholm and a one-night hotel stay there. Additional expenses are included in the attached budget.

I'm very happy to answer any questions your members may have. We'd very much like to fill this vacancy if possible. I participated in a similar exchange to Sweden sponsored by District 7710 in 2015, and it was an absolutely wonderful experience.

We formed life-long friendships on that tour and I expect we will this year as well.

RCOR President's 7-Day Forecast

Unsettled weather is back with a vengeance this week! After a dry end of April, rain on Sunday was a welcome sight. We will continue to have warm/humid days with a chance for showers and storms each day this week. An upper level trough and associated cold front will cross the area sometime Thursday through Friday and is expected to bring a colder airmass into the region for the weekend. The approaching cold front will bring us the best chance of showers and thunderstorms this week. Make sure to stay alert for any severe weather later on this week! Each day will see temperatures close to 90F with lows only dropping into the mid 60s overnight. By the weekend, the cold front should moderate temps to daytime highs in the mid 70's and lows in the low 50's.
