RCOR President's 7-Day Forecast

After a stormy hot and humid weekend and Memorial Day, we're looking at calmer and drier weather for the rest of this week. Temperatures are expected to moderate with highs only reaching around 80F by Friday and Saturday. It will also feel drier. The decrease of atmospheric moisture will allow overnight lows to fall into the mid 50s by the weekend. Skies will be partly cloudy to mostly sunny throughout the rest of the week with gentle breezes in the afternoons. A more humid airmass will move into the area on Sunday, bringing with it a chance for showers and thunderstorms.
