The program helps students in our area who are experiencing food insecurity, including providing identified students a weekend snack bag of individually wrapped, kid friendly foods to take home with them on the weekends, and a summer feeding program to provide families with supplemental foods while children are away from the child nutrition program in their schools. The District Grant with a club match totaled \$7,500 to purchase food for meals for over 1,000 students throughout the year. Club members also volunteered to "stuff" backpacks for children to carry food home as a part of the events described above.
