- Club President Clifton Pike, Club CART Chair David Whitley, Executive Director Tiffany Ervin of The CART Foundation, and club member/District CART Chair Ann Super, presented a check for \$1,191.32 as the club’s first contribution to the CART Foundation for this year, following Tiffany’s inspirational presentation, “The Power Of One” to the club in March. Member Barry Lutz was also recognized for becoming a monthly donor to the CART Foundation to advance Alzheimer’s research.
- Three New Members were welcomed to the club in March: Gretchen Derda (sponsor-her cousin and club Charter member, Mitch Khoury), Carolyn Perrigo, a long-time Rotarian, Past President, and PHF (transferred from the Morehead City Rotary), and Rodger Allison (sponsor Paul Platek)

- Three members (Paul Platek, Andy Garlick, Deedra Durocher) from the New Bern Breakfast Rotary club served as the primary facilitators for the RLI sessions in Asheboro, NC on March 29. The club now has seven certified RLI facilitators – all of whom encourage fellow Rotarians to participate in future RLI offerings!
- The club's signature project – **Kicks-For-Kids** purchased and delivered 300 pairs of new shoes to elementary and middle school students throughout Craven County in early March. Since this program began in 1996, the New Bern Breakfast Club has donated approximately 8,000 shoes (est. \$250,000). Member Tom Gingrich (far left) has coordinated this important program for area children for the last 15 years and works closely with our business partner, Todd Whisnant (second from left) of Coastal Sole to purchase the shoes.

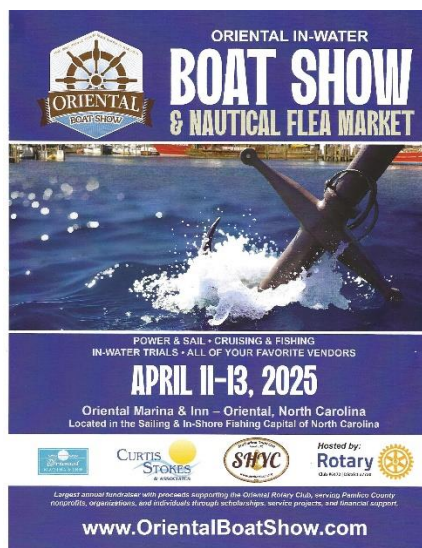

District 7720 Conference A Success!

- For those of you who attended the District 7720 Conference in New Bern from May 7-9, you know that we had some great speakers and programs. As the Volunteer Coordinator this year, I want to thank all the volunteers, primarily from the New Bern and New Bern Breakfast Rotary clubs, who made everything come together!
- On Friday afternoon, we heard from, and had an open conversation with, Patrick Eakes, Rotary International Director (2024-2026) who has held many Rotary positions at the club, District, Zone, and International levels. Our District Treasurer and New Bern member, Bill Sherman presented the Treasurer's Final Report for 2023-24 and the current Finance Report through the end of March this year. (If you would like a copy of either or both reports, please let me know since I have copies of each). Friday evening, Conference participants had the opportunity to enjoy themselves in New Bern or join many of us at "An Evening Of Comedy" hosted by the Rotary Club of New Bern.
- Saturday morning, after the Color Guard by ROTC students from New Bern High School, and Meloni Wray of New Bern Rotary leading us in the Star-Spangled Banner, we heard from Ron Pierce, District 7690 Governor. His presentation on the reasons we are losing Rotary members, and more importantly what we can, and must, do about that, was provocative, entertaining, and offered real solutions to hold and increase our clubs' membership. Presentations were also given by District Foundation Chair, Terry Lubsen (New Bern), and District Grants Chair, Paul Platek (New Bern Breakfast) who shared that in Rotary Year 2023-24, 27 District Grants were awarded to 23 out of 34 clubs for a total of approximately \$50,000 to make a difference in their local communities! District Youth Services Chair, Andy Garlick (New Bern Breakfast), and Zone 33 End Polio Now Chair, Nancy Barbee (District 7730) also spoke about their programs. The morning included an important address by District 6980 Governor, Sonya LaBosco, who outlined the realities and consequences of Human Trafficking, and what her District in Florida has initiated to focus on this serious issue. She then introduced Brittany Rohr, a survivor of human trafficking, who gave a very personal account of her own experiences and how she has moved on with her life to help others in such situations and make a difference with a nonprofit organization she has founded, Kind I Am, with a mission to reunite the world with kindness paid forward (for more information, I encourage you to go to www.kindiam.org).
- The afternoon was left open for participants to enjoy New Bern and take time to review all the great tabletop information on the activities of District clubs, Shelter Box, and more in the "House of Friendship" displays.
- During the Saturday evening Banquet, Magician Brian Walsh entertained the audience with assistance from our DG Gene and other members, and DG Gene's youngest son, Whit, offered a truly special entertainment to close the evening (I see great things happening for this impressive young man!). There were also multiple awards presented, and I am so pleased that many of our Area 8 clubs and individual members received recognition for their efforts and donations during the 2023-2024 Rotary year:

- A particularly surprising and very humbling award was presented to me by DG Gene. The “Service Above Self Award,” which I did not even know existed, is presented by Rotary International each year to 150 Rotarians nominated by District Governors throughout the world for members whose service has had an impact to make a difference throughout their life.
- The Conference closed on Sunday morning with an Interfaith Service led by retired Pastor Bill Sherman (NB) and a Memorial Service for six District members who passed in the last year, including four from Area 8:
 - Vanceboro – Claude F. Taylor, Jerry Phillips, Richard L. Cannon, Jr.
 - New Bern Breakfast – William “Bill” Taylor
- Also on Sunday morning, presentations were made by District CART Chair, Ann Super, and an overview of Shelter Box was offered by Pauline Dunbar-Berens and Bill Berens. DG Elect, Brownie Futrell shared information on the Rotary International Conference in Calgary this June, and the tentative plans for the 2026 District Conference in Atlantic Beach. DG Gene Foster closed the Conference and introduced Meloni Wray (NB) who led us in our traditional closing song: “Let There Be Peace on Earth.”

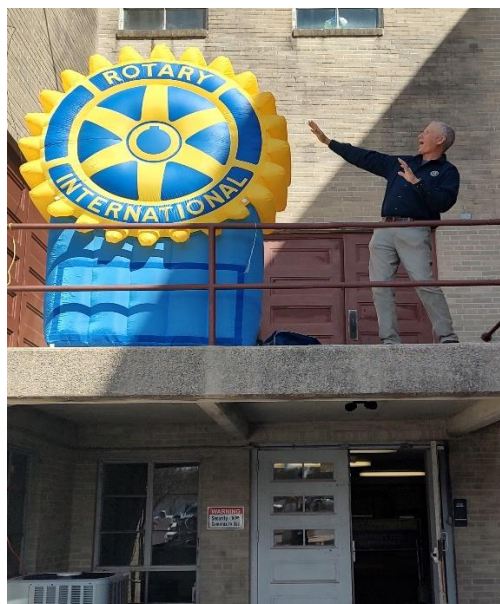

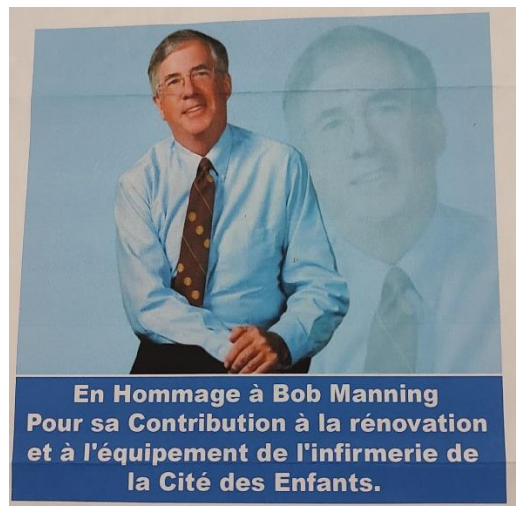
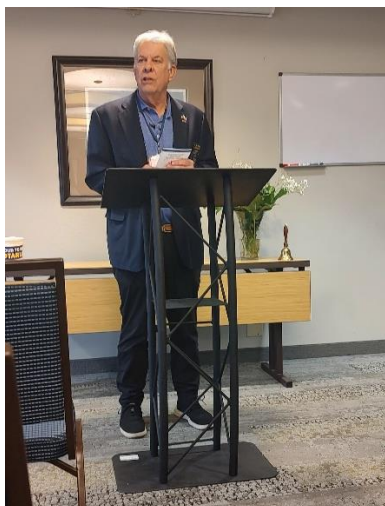
