SBI Program: Tom Lamont, Boys and Girls Homes of North Carolina

Tom Lamont, a resident of Wilmington, was educated at the University of North Carolina Wilmington, where he received the Bachelor of Arts in speech communication in 1980. He continued his studies in broadcast journalism and in 1982 received the Master of Arts in radio/television from the University of Mississippi.



After a 19-year career in radio and television news, he came to Boys and Girls Homes of North Carolina for the first time in July 1998. He stayed in that position for two and a half years and returned to his alma mater, UNC Wilmington as the assistant director of alumni relations. In March 2004, he returned to Boys and Girls Home until 2011, when he left to take care of his aging parents. He then worked for five years for the YMCA in Wilmington as the resource development officer. Most recently, he worked for the Wilmington Sharks baseball team, where he was the director of community relations. He has now returned to the Boys and Girls Homes as the director of community engagement.

He is married to his wife, Donna, and has one daughter, a future son-in-law and three grandchildren.

Another Successful Rise Against Hunger Event

There were participants from Girl Scouts, Girls and Boys Home, Beulah Baptist Church congregation and our own Rotarian's and their families from both Shallotte and SBI clubs.

In less than two hours these meals were measured, sealed, boxed and then put in a truck for shipment. It was truly one of the greatest team building events we've ever been part of. While the desire to feed the hungry was our primary focus, it was a joyous event where we danced, sang, and enjoyed a sense of of community, and no one left there without a smile and a grateful feeling that we were part of something that provided enough food for 47 children to eat for one full school year.
