

Yoga found me in 2012 exactly when I needed a change in my life. After practicing yoga for a year, in 2013, I quit my job in insurance sales, took a teacher training course and began my self-study of Yoga philosophy. I began teaching yoga classes at the CrossFit Gym where I was a regular, and at local homeowner association facilities where there was no fee to rent the space. It was an appropriate beginning, with very small classes and few followers. Over the years my study into the Yoga philosophy expanded to include Buddhist philosophy and The Yoga Sutras. This is when my love for yoga grew beyond my wildest imagination. The light within me suddenly began to shine, my class attendance grew and I had dedicated students practicing with me on a regular basis, wherever I was teaching.

It was my devotion to my students and my desire to offer them a deeper understanding of the Yoga that led me to Rishikesh, India, The Yoga Capital of The World, in 2017. It was in this beautiful place that I was able to further my teaching certification and to delve deeper into the Yogic lifestyle. It was during my 5 weeks in Rishikesh, India, at the base of the Himalayan Mountains, on the bank of the Sacred Ganges River, that I earned my 200 Hr Yoga Teacher Training and found my True Self. It is also here, on my second to last night, Christmas Eve 2017, that I met Prabhavati Dwabha, the Founder and Director of Ramana's Garden Children's Home, and 4 year old Ansheka who slept in my lap throughout the entire movie, It's a Wonderful Life. I was able to return the next day to donate most of my belongings that I carried to India and to enjoy an amazing fresh lunch in their Organic Cafe.

I returned home with a deeper understanding of Yoga and Asana (Postures) and an incredible desire to offer it to the world through my yoga classes and yoga retreats. My classes now reflect much of what I learned in India to include asana, elements of yoga philosophy and meditation in every class. I also returned home having left a piece of my heart at Ramana's Garden. I was so touched by that precious child who curled up in my lap for rest and the Founder's self-less dedication as the mother to all of the children who lived at her orphanage. I knew that someday I would return to do my part to help them. That opportunity came 2 years later in 2019 after my friend and I raised over \$1,6000 to donate to Ramana's Garden. As fate would have it, I was not able to complete the journey due to illness, but my friend did deliver the money directly to Prabhavati Dwabha and was able to share with her the part that SBI Rotary played in making the donation possible.



Now accepting WBHS Scholarship Applications!

The South Brunswick Islands Rotary Club selects and awards from those WBHS graduating seniors who apply: at least, two \$1,000 academic scholarships, a \$1,000 vocational scholarship, a \$1000 Interact scholarship and the Richard Lancaster Award (a \$500 band award) to pursue a degree from a university, college, community or junior college. See below for guidelines and requirements to make application for a South Brunswick Islands Rotary scholarship.

To be considered for a South Brunswick Island Rotary Club Academic &/or Vocational Scholarship the applicant must:

- Be a graduating senior of WBHS, living in the home of a parent or legal guardian, who is a full time resident of Brunswick County.
- Turn in an original high school transcript with class size, ranking and a GPA of 2.75 or higher (based on an 85- 100 point scale).
- Demonstrate a history of commitment to the community through leadership activities, community service, &/or work activities in responses within application narratives, letters of recommendation, and personal interview.
- Submit completed South Brunswick Islands Rotary Scholarship application to the WBHS guidance office by end of day Wednesday, March 11, 2020.


Applicants for the Richard Lancaster Band award must also demonstrate a commitment to band service.

The 2020-23 COL will start work in July. You, as a Rotarian in good standing, can propose a change to anything you believe to be important. That change will require approval from your Club and the District, and may then be submitted to the COL. If the COL approves, it will go to the RI Board of Directors who will accept or reject the proposed change.

Past Governor Lee Dixon (Morehead City Noon Rotary Club) is our delegate to the new COL. PDG Ken Dresser (South Brunswick Islands Rotary Club) is the alternate. Please help me congratulate and thank them for their service in this position.

If you have an idea for a change, please discuss with your Club President, Area Governor, or one of us in the Governor line. Ask me if you would like detailed information on the process.
