Fayetteville Rotary Club Meeting

President Paul asked the Club to provide \$500 for the Boys and Girls home for the upcoming Rotary Day event on Saturday March 26th. The Club approved the request for the funds to be delivered during Rotary Day.

Club Program: President Paul introduced David Sgro who spoke about his mission trips to Guatemala and the Philippines to improve their quality of life. He says poor people make bad decisions because they do not know better, they seek bad shortcuts. In Catechol, Guatemala where he has been going since 2010, he has been working to improve the indigenous families' lives. He goes back several times a year to take items for the families to improve their lives. He also is helping them create water wells so they will not have to carry water long distances, from rivers, streams, and ponds. He provides the technical advice so an outdoor latrine will not contaminate a water well. Most recently he provided coal stoves that direct the smoke away from the stove to the open air. Smoke from cook fires in the homes often contaminates the home affecting breathing. Breathing the smoke for years often kills. He realizes when what he provides breaks, they want him to fix or replace it. He has come up with ideas for micro businesses such as the making of jewelry. He takes the jewelry for sale in the US to get the best return. Dave obtains the money he needs to help the villages by running a Karate studio.
