Club Program: PDG Dave introduced Drew Ziegler and Camp Director Mark Kline from Methodist University, who spoke about the General Shelton Leadership Camp that is generally held every summer. The camp takes 30 high school students each summer for a one week in residence leadership experience. It is designed to help students expand their knowledge and skills of what it takes to be an effective leader. It imparts General Shelton's corner stones of values-based leadership – honesty, integrity, compassion, diversity, and social responsibility. The core curriculum includes leadership roles and accountability, team building, leadership styles and situations, public speaking, and goal setting. Dr Ziegler showed a short video to introduce the Club to the camp and campers. Dr Kline told the Club that the camp gives scholarships so that those not able to pay can receive the experience. The Club gave the program \$600 to cover the cost of one camper for the week. Campers who begin camp as skeptics leave a week later as believers.
