Pam Hilbert introduced our speakers for the day. Pam Hansen, who was a previous Clerk of Court for Carteret County, and a past member of the Noon Club, and her husband Johnny Burgess, a retired US Marine. Both became very interested in bee keeping and set out to learn all they could about it. Johnny is now the Secretary of the Local Bee Keepers Club, and they now have 6 bee hives they monitor in their back yard. They have collected 6 gals. of honey this past year, and they also were able to locate a wild swarm of bees and relocate them to their back yard. Members of the Bee Keepers club are organizing a fundraiser. There are many types of honey which also present different flavors, based on the source of pollen the bees have gathered. The most common flavor is from wild flowers. They hope to organize a "Honey Tasting" to introduce the varieties of honey that are available. Carteret County is among the top 10 for Bee Keepers. Triple S Bee Farm located in Stella has over 2000 bee hives. The fund raiser will be a dinner on September 12 to introduce 5 different flavors of honey and how they are used. Also, Pam advised of a threat to the American bees and their hives. It is the Northern giant hornet that has been imported into the US. They have been found in Washington state. There have been traps set up for the hornets in the eastern counties of N.C.



Happy Dollars were conducted by Lee Dixon. Lee can always present a lively collection of bills, and he came through again.
