Please register your project by April 15th to be eligible for reimbursement of expenses. More details and registration on DACdb.

Thank you to all our clubs who received district grants and completed their projects. In total, we provided more than \$60,000 in grants and funded 50 projects. If your club needs inspiration for next year's grant, look at the grants this year or the past several years (all are available on DACdb) to spark your imagination.

Now is the time for your club to look at the District Governor's and the Rotary Citation Awards. The District Governor Award is located on DACdb and is a fillable document. We hope all our clubs will strive to achieve this award for 2022-23. The Rotary Citation does not have an official form to complete. Rather, each club identifies and completes at least 13 goals in Rotary Club Central and if achieved, your club automatically receives the Rotary Citation. Both awards must be completed by June 30, 2023.

#### **Must update Interact Club Advisors Annually**

Interact clubs are required to have a reported advisor annually. Advisors may be a member of the sponsoring Rotary, a school administrator or faculty member, or a community volunteer serving as an adult contact to the Interact club. Although more than one person may serve in this role for your Interact club, Rotary International requires only one individual to be reported per Rotary each year (1 July - 30 June).

Even if your Interact clubs are "inactive" due to Covid or other reasons, consider keeping the charter active by reporting an advisor.


## SBI Rotary Packages 10,000 Meals In Less Than 2 Hours


