Message from Governor Allen!

May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Itâ \in TMs been observed in U.S. since 1949 with the aim to raise awareness about mental health issues, reduce stigma around mental illnesses, and advocate for policies that support people with mental health conditions. Our Rotary theme to â \in ^TCreate Hope in the Worldâ \in TM encourages members to pursue the same aims that were established in 1949 with Rotary members and communities around the world.

Here are some ways you can get involved:

- Our district Mental Health Task Force has partnered with Veteran Services of the Carolinas to conduct 5 Mental Health First Aid workshops. We have also conducted two workshops in the district â€" one in Brunswick County and the ACEs workshop as part of the recent District Conference. But we can do more. Bring your passion to the task force or organize an event in your community. What a fantastic idea for a district or global grant next Rotary year!
- 2. Rotary Action Group on Mental Health Initiatives: This group has seen a significant increase in membership since the pandemic, indicating a heightened awareness of mental health and wellness. They aim to fill the gaps in understanding and resources related to mental health. Home Mental Health Initiatives Rotary Action Group (ragonmentalhealth.org)
- 3. Rotary Club of Mental Health & Wellness: This is one of the first cause-based Rotary clubs to focus on mental health and wellness. The club, which was chartered in May during Mental Health Awareness Month in the U.S., includes professionals in the mental health field and others who hold the issue close to their hearts.
- 4. Medizin Hilft (Medicine Helps): Did you know that in 2020, the Rotary Club of Morehead City-Lookout, North Carolina, worked with Medizin Hilft to secure a global grant that allows the organization to offer free mental health services. This is a nearly all-volunteer organization that donates thousands of hours of medical care to refugees and migrants each year.

Some facts to consider:

- More than 264 million people worldwide are affected by depression.
- Although there are effective treatments for mental disorders, between 76% and 85% of people in low- and middle-income countries receive no treatment for their condition.
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death among 15- to 29-year-olds globally.
- Depression and anxiety disorders cost the global economy \$1 trillion per year.
- There are 800,000 deaths per year from suicide.
- Mental health conditions are especially common in populations affected by humanitarian crises.



We have now helped collect 1684 units of blood for the Red Cross.


